The Friendly Games

The Commonwealth is an organization of 54 countries which have a common history. These countries are Canada, New Zealand, Pakistan, Barbados, Sri Lanka and Zambia. Queen Elizabeth II is the head of the organization. Today the Commonwealth works to protect the rights of people,

organizes special programs to develop trade, science, health and help young people.

Special sports games take place every four years in one of the member countries. They are called the Empire Games. The first competition was in Hamilton, Canada in 1930. There were players

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from eleven countries, and the sports included athletics, boxing, bowls, rowing, swimming and wrestling.

The Empire Games were in England twice: in London in 1934 and in Manchester in 2002. Then they were in Canada, Britain or Australasia - in Jamaica in 1966 and in Malaysia in 1998. The number of countries has become more than 70, and thousands of athletes now participate in these games. When the USA doesn't participate, Australia, Canada and the British countries usually win the most medals.

The country that organizes these games, usually build special sports facilities. Manchester spent 20 years

when it was preparing for the 2002 Games and built a new 48,000-seat stadium which cost over £100 million. Luckily, there were more than one million visitors at the Games and it brought much money to the city.

The Commonwealth Games have their own Olympic torch ceremony. On Commonwealth Day, the Queen gives a baton (эстафетная палочка) with a message to an athlete. Then it runs through different Commonwealth countries until it comes to the country where the competition takes place. The President of the Sports Committee opens the baton and reads the Queen's message at the opening ceremony of the Games.
